

SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE

Whether you have attended a service in person or watched one online, you've all just listened to the sermon together. Now how do you talk about it as a family or as a group of friends?

Use these discussion questions—along with the sermon outline from the bulletin—for a family devotional or just to start a conversation around the lunch/dinner table.

What was the primary passage from the sermon? Read the passage together!

In a sentence or two, what was the main idea or big picture of the sermon?

Was there an illustration, prop, or example that helped you understand better or that you think you will especially remember? Explain it.

Did something related to any of these big ideas/themes stand out to you in particular?

- the character/actions of God
- the broken/lost nature of people
- the sufficiency/gift of Jesus
- the need for personal faith
- the shortness of life on earth

Was there anything new that you have never heard or thought about before?

Was there anything you did not understand?

Was there anything you that disagreed with or that made you uncomfortable?

What is one thing that you plan to do or change this week because of the sermon?

Don't feel like you need to use all of the questions. Pick and choose. The point is to have an intentional conversation. Give yourself the freedom to see where it goes!

Don't forget to take some time to ask how you can pray for one another specifically – and take time to do it right now!
